


Anglo-Saxons?!

Issues for the Early Anglo-Saxons:

- Establishment of the various kingdoms in Britain, aka the heptarchy: Northumbria, Mercia, East Anglia, Essex, Kent, Sussex, and Wessex
- (Re)Christianization: Augustine of Canterbury (sent from Rome): Non Angli, sed angeli
- The Council of Whitby: 663/664: Irish or Roman Christianity?

Built during the reign of Theodosius II (408-450)














Hagia Sophia (above), built between 532-537

The Imperial Door, Hagia Sophia








The Imperial Door, San Vitale



Apse mosaic depicting JC offering the crown to Justinian



The Gothic War (535-554): Aftermath


- Rome suffered massive damage; it is left largely abandoned and in ruins
- Milan and other cities destroyed
- Senate disappears (578-580)
- Lombards invade and take much of Italy by the end of the 6th c.



The Gothic War (535-554): Aftermath

The reign of J as turning point

- Power in the Med shifts WEST to the Lombards and esp. the Franks
- Italy is fragmented (Imperial and Lombard territories)
- The Empire was bankrupt and exhausted
 - Also exclusively GREEK in character and language
 - The west...left on its own...
