Moms Mabley DVDs and Films

If you just see one of these films, view "Amazing Grace" (1974), Moms' final film. Moms plays a pivotal role as the guiding spirit in a neighborhood struggling with local corruption. If you just see two, add Whoopi Goldberg's tribute to Moms. "Killer Diller" and "Boarding House Blues" were typical of a more slapstick sort of comedy of the 1940s, while "The Emperor Jones" is a Paul Robeson/Eugene O'Neill classic, Moms only plays the very small, uncredited role of Marcella.
