Join Dr. Les Adler and an OLLI travel group in a Summer 2024 exploration of New Mexico's rich cultural, artistic and scientific heritage from its Native American and Hispanic roots to its central role in the creation of the Atomic Age. This fully curated 9-day, 8-night tour including 3 nights in Albuquerque and 5 nights in Santa Fe provides numerous 'roads less traveled' opportunities for cultural immersion through meetings with New Mexican artists, museum curators and historical experts along with museum, gallery and guided visits to Bandelier National Monument, Los Alamos and currently occupied pueblos such as Acoma and Taos.

A center of continuing creativity in the arts, crafts, architecture and sciences, New Mexico provides a unique expression of the convergence of ancient visions with modern times. Also, the views are beautiful and the food is great!

### Friday, August 23, 2024

Saturday, August 24 Meals included: B, L, D

After breakfast (included at the hotel each day) we depart for the Turquoise Museum. One of the most misunderstood gemstones displayed in one of Albuquerque's most unique buildings - a castle, it is one-of-a-kind.

Lunch is included at the Frontier Restaurant, an iconic Route 66 eatery since 1971(full of wonderful artwork).

This afternoon we'll visit the Indian Pueblo Cultural Center, owned and operated by the 19 Pueblo tribes of New Mexico and admission to their museum and 2 art galleries The highlight of our visit is a dance performance.

A New Mexican dinner is included tonight.

#### Sunday, August 25 Meals included: B. L

This moming we'll visit Petroglyph National Monument. Located on Albuquerque's west side with 100's of archeological sites and an estimated 24,000 petroglyph images carved by Ancestral Puebloan and early Spanish settlers. Then we will drive one hour to Acoma Pueblo: direct descendants of Chaco Canyon, Acoma has been occupied since 960AD. Lunch is included upon our arrival followed by a mesa-top tour led by a tribal member. We travel part of Historic 66 on our way back to town. Dinner is your choice tonight and we are very close to many restaurants in the Old Town District.

#### Monday, August 26 Meals included: B. L. D

Today, exploring the early development of the atomic age, we will first visit the National Museum of Nuclear Science and History. Before leaving for Santa Fe we will stop for lunch at the iconic Owl Café and then travel along the Turguoise Trail, a scenic byway and stop in Madrid (an eclectic artist community).

Santa Fe is one of our country's greatest art cities with many art galleries and

museums. Our orientation tour will include the Loretto Chapel Museum with its Miraculous Staircase and will end at the Historic Plaza and the Native American Portal Program.

We'll check into the Inn of the Governors, located in the heart of downtown, for a 5 night stay and relax or go explore more of the Plaza before we meet for an included dinner on the Plaza.

#### Tuesday, August 27 Meals included: B

This morning we'll visit Los Alamos with a guest guide and local historian and see the History Museum along with Fuller Lodge and the Bradbury Science Museum. Lunch is planned at Otowi Cafeteria, the only LANL building accessible by the public, dining among the scientists! This afternoon we'll take a special walk in the footsteps of the Ancient Ones in Frijoles Canyon at Bandelier National Monument.

#### Wednesday, August 28 Meals included: B

Our tour guide will be sure you know about Santa Fe's many options of museums and galleries as well as activities off the Plaza. You can book options or partake in a number of optional professional tours.

Another choice may be to join our tour guide and (if the Pueblo is open to receive visitors for the first time since COVID) travel just south of Albuquerque to Isleta Pueblo

to attend the St. Augustine Feast Day. The carving of St. Augustine is paraded

through the village and then placed in an arbor where dances are done in honor and patronage. We'll arrive in Santa Fe approx. 1:00 with the afternoon for free time.

#### Thursday, August 29

Meals included: B

Today we will travel north to Taos by way of the Village of Chimayo whose current residents' ancestry dates back to Spanish Colonizers in the 1500's and they still practice the Spanish colonial arts of weaving and carving. We will visit a weaver's shop and El Santuario Mission with it's mysterious healing dirt.



Continuing on to Taos we will enjoy an authentic Mexican meal for lunch and cross the 656' high Rio Grande Gorge Bridge to visit the Earthship Biotecture Visitor Center. We'll also visit Taos Pueblo where tours are conducted by tribal guides. Also included is a visit to the Fechin House: the Taos Art Museum. Dinner is your choice in Santa Fe this

evening. Friday, August 30 Meals included: B, D Free day to complete your list of site-seeing aided by our tour guide. An early farewell dinner is planned away from downtown in preparation for one of Santa Fe's most time revered traditions: the burning of **Zozobra!** "Old Man Gloom" a 50' marionette and unique New Mexican tradition.

Tens of thousands of visitors will flock to the Plaza and walk up the hill to Fort Marcy, arriving at about 8pm. The burning takes place at 9:00 and will most likely be the top news story throughout the state. To witness it in person is extremely special.
