IN MEMORIAM

Robert Santos

Robert Santos, known to friends as "Bob," a pediatric dentist who kept generations of patients and parts calm over four decades in the San Francisco Bay Area, passed away on June 20, from cancer. Born in 1934 and raised in Richmond, CA, Bob attended Stanford University and UCSF Dental School, married Mary Lou, and raised two children in the Bay Area. While in private practice, Dr. Santos was appointed to the Dental Board of Examiners by then-Governor Ronald Reagan. Bob was predeceased by his wife, Mary Lou, and later married Julia Teskey and moved to Sonoma County. Bob joined the OLLI program at SSU as a student in 2001, and later served on the Curriculum Committee and Advisory Board. He received the Ed Stolman Award in 2012 for his contributions to OLLI. Bob developed the OLLI program in Healdsburg and later worked with the AAUW lifelong learning program. Dr. Santos is survived by his loving wife, Julia, his children Lori Santos (Craig Schwed), Lisa Santos, and Paul Santos, and his grandchildren Melanie, Leslie and Allison Schwed. Bob was a lifelong fan of the SF Giants, enjoyed golf, entertaining friends, and loved food, wine, and travel.
