Rutles: All You Need Is Cash (1978)

The Beatles were big fans of the Pythons

 Paul McCartney stopped recording sessions when Python was being broadcast so that everyone in the studio could watch it

Rutles approvals

- George Harrison became friends with Eric Idle, and played a major role in getting the approvals of all the Beatles for the Rutles film to use archival footage for backgrounds
- John Lennon was afraid that the movie would not go out, so he kept his approval copy of the film instead of returning it
- Paul needed some convincing, as Eric Idle's portrayal of the Paul-like character might have been a bit flippant. Linda McCartney convinced Paul, and the movie went out.

Rutles production

- Early two songs played on Eric Idle's Rutland Weekend Television
- Eric hosted Saturday Night Live and SNL producer Lorne Michaels involved the SNL cast in it, and then produced the movie

Mockumentary

- Previous mockumentaries included Orson Welles' "Citizen Kane" (1941) and Woody Allen's "Take The Money And Run" (1969), as well as the Beatles' own takeoffs on themselves
 - A Hard Day's Night (1964)
 - Help! (1966)
 - Yellow Submarine (1968)
